First, Happy Anniversary to Chris Coleman on his Third Year working at Kiln Creek as our Kiln Creek Golf Club & Resort, General Manager. I vividly remember January & February in 2014 when we were really struggling to get control of our purchase of the Golf Course, Country Club facilities, and staff. Chris was the last one we interviewed for the job of "making things work" out of about a half dozen candidates. He took the job and we've never looked back except to be amazed at how far we've come in three years – WOW!!!

Rather than recounting the history for everyone, I'd say we've really found the "sweet spot" in our reorganization efforts. The Main Club House is now in use year-round, and owners are actually using the new facilities. YEAH!! Our EXCELLENT STAFF now works together like the strong team they've become. Club Staff, HOA Staff, and the Agronomy Team now REALLY complement one another. Our financials are in good order and we are making well informed decisions. The Strategic Plan is our guide for future improvements.

A new restaurant will be the focus with a bigger footprint for different types of dining. A new multi-purpose area in the old indoor pool space will offer community event and commercial opportunities. Second, repairing portions of the Kiln Creek walking pathway and adding Fitness Stations along the way. Get a full work out along the walkway. Also, develop an inviting, landscaped entrance at the cross roads of Brick Kiln & Kiln Creek Blvd as you head into the Club Area. We meet every quarter to share information between the Neighborhood Boards and the Master Association Board. Also, a Neighborhood Watch is the best way to secure your home & local community. I know it seems early to be talking about reviews, because we typically start the community review process near the end of March. This is the first year we have been conducting rear inspections from the golf course, so we started earlier.

I conduct the in-depth "Community Review" during the early spring into the late summer months when items can be addressed while the weather is good. Please remember that these reviews are conducted to maintain the high standard of living our residents have grown accustomed to. We have a beautiful, award winning community that we all want to see stay that way!

If you <u>do</u> receive a notice, please do not get offended, as most of your neighbors will probably receive a notice too. Don't forget that we are always willing to work with homeowners when an extension is needed. If you receive a letter but will need an extension, or have already planned work to be done, simply call or email me at <a href="mailto:sherrill@kilncreek.org">sherrill@kilncreek.org</a>.

We would also like to remind you that we do <u>NOT</u> go onto anyone's property when doing the community reviews unless there are certain circumstances that we need to. The reviews are mainly conducted from our work vehicles; however, sometimes we need to go by foot or on a 4-wheel "gator" onto common area to see certain items or to go around a lake. We look at your house from different angles, from down the street and even from surrounding streets. So be aware when checking your house for roof stains, chimney caps etc., you may need to check all sides of your home to see what we see. Please also be reminded that although our governing documents give us the authority to go onto a property if a violation is present, we do not typically do so unless there are extenuating circumstances.

# Exterior Alteration Reminders From the Architectural Review Board Coordinator

The following items are questions I receive frequently or items that are overlooked when turning in applications for exterior alterations:

- o <u>Fences</u>- If you are installing a fence, whether replacing an existing one or adding a new one, your fence will look differently from the others you see driving throughout Kiln Creek. Our Standards changed a long time ago with regards to which side faces outward, and we have been working hard to make sure residents install them the correct way ever since. The Standards now require the "smooth" side to face OUTWARD, and the inside to have the horizontal cross supports.
- O <u>Tree Removal</u>- When turning in an application for removing a tree please remember to include a plat with the tree(S) marked with an "X" and a picture of the tree(s). If you do not have a plat (survey) you may use a GIS map downloaded from the York County or Newport News City websites.
- o <u>Windows</u>- ANYTIME you replace windows an application is required, whether they will remain the same or change in appearance.
- O <u>Satellite Dishes</u>- An application is required to install a satellite dish. In our standards on page 34, we list four preferable locations. If the installer cannot place the dish in one of these locations, we will need a letter from the installer stating the reason why and the alternative spot when you turn in the application.
- Neighborhood Associations If you live in a village that has a Sub-Association (typically townhomes or condos) you will have to apply for exterior alterations to your neighborhood ARB Board in addition as ours. You can call your Neighborhood Property Management Company to find out how to apply to them. \*Westgate are considered single family homes and will only need to apply to KCOA
- o **ARB Meeting times** The ARB Board meets "every other" Thursday, typically first thing in the morning (9:00 AM). All applications & required information must be turned in by the Tuesday prior to be placed on the agenda. If you turn in an application on the day we meet, it will not be reviewed until the following meeting date (2 weeks away).

### **Swim test bracelets**

At the March 23rd Board of Directors meeting, the Board approved a significant update to the Pool Rules. We have changed the swim test rules, so that only residents with RED or GREEN Rec. Passes will be required to take the Swim Test to go in the lap lanes and deep end. We know it has been cumbersome for all residents to take a swim test, and hope you will be delighted with this change in the rules! Please take note, that if the lifeguards feel any resident is not a confident swimmer, at their discretion, they have the right to ask anyone to take a swim test regardless of their Rec. Pass color.

This year the swim test bracelet system will be slightly different. Last year we lost a lot of bracelets, which is very costly. This year, you will receive a permanent bracelet to show you have passed the test. You will keep this bracelet and take it home with you. If you lose the bracelet, there will be a small fee to replace it (similar to how you get a replacement rec pass). We haven't worked out all of the details yet, but we will be sure to keep you posted in our email blast and at the at pool once the season has started.

### REC PASSES

DON'T FORGET, pool season is right around the corner, so make sure you have your updated Rec Pass NOW! We did not ask specific neighborhoods to come into the office this year because it seems there has been a steady flow of residents updating their passes throughout the year. However, the closer it gets to the pool opening, the more residents come in; especially the last few days before the pool opens. So, if you don't want to wait in line for your pass, please stop by the office a few weeks before the pool opens on Saturday, May 27th!!

### Attention all Drivers, Bikers, and Pedestrians

Laura Carnrike wrote in the November/December 2016 Courier of the Bike and Pedestrian Study that the HOA Board has requested of Newport News City and York County/VDOT. Many residents (thank you!!) provided input for the study by completing a Bike and Pedestrian survey last fall. Some residents commented on difficulties getting around on motorized wheelchairs/scooters. Many commented that the speed limit on the main roadways needed to be reduced. Recommendations based on your responses were submitted to Newport News City, York County/VDOT, and, in some cases, the Board of Directors for consideration and action. Now for an update on some of these recommendations:

Speed Limit reduction: A 24-hour speed study was performed in Kiln Creek in early February 2017. Per Newport News officials, "85% of the vehicles traveling through Kiln Creek are doing so within the posted speed limit; we cannot reduce the speed limit based on this 85<sup>th</sup> percentile. This is a good result." Law Enforcement Presence: The HOA Office continues to work with York County and Newport News to monitor our road for speeders, particularly during high volume hours. They've also requested that York County monitor the signaled crossing at the Recreation Center more often. Residents: if you are having an issue with the crossing at the Rec Center, please contact VDOT at #1-800-367-7623 or by VDOT website at https://my.vdot.virginia.gov

Crosswalk at Kiln Creek Elementary: Although easements were approved by the HOA Board two years ago, it's taken awhile for Newport News to move on it. According to Newport News officials, a project to install a concrete sidewalk and crosswalk that connects the existing concrete sidewalk (on the north side of Kiln Creek Elementary School's property) to the existing path on the east side of Kiln Creek Parkway "has been approved and the project is ready for construction around May/June 2017."

Bike/Pedestrian Path Maintenance: Runners, walkers, and bikers were vocal about maintenance on the walking trails. A couple of years of low precipitation have raised tree roots causing damage to the path. This year's budget allows for repair of the worst areas, with the two-year strategic plan calling for repair or replacement of the path to enhance usability and safety, as well as possibly creating additional walking/bike trails in other areas of the community in the future.

Crosswalk Study: Newport News has completed the first phase of the study for Villages within Newport News that are across from the walking/bike path and it is in the City's review process. York County/VDOT has not yet provided any updates.

Access across Victory Boulevard to the Shopping Center: This was a top request by residents and has been submitted to York County/VDOT. York County/VDOT has not yet responded. Stay tuned for further updates in future editions of the Courier.

### Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety in Kiln Creek

Pedestrian and bicycle safety is extremely important in residential areas such as Kiln Creek. While most are aware of the basics when it comes to safely walking and biking throughout the community, here are a few tips to help keep you and your neighbors safe.

- Wear bright clothing during the day and reflective gear at night. Use lights at night or when visibility is poor. White in front, red in the rear – just like a car.
- Use sidewalks or paths to separate you from moving traffic. If no sidewalk is present, stay on the shoulder and/or as far away from traffic as possible.
- Be alert for drivers who are parking, idling in a parking space, or backing out of a parking space.
- Cross at a crosswalk using pedestrian crossing signals, when available.
- If crossing midblock, wait at each edge for traffic to clear from both directions.
- While crossing, look left and right for traffic; be prepared to get out of the way if a driver doesn't see you.
- Expect others not to see you. Some drivers may be distracted. Do not step in to the roadway until the driver has stopped for you, or has acknowledged your intent to cross with eye contact, a wave or a nod.



### Crosswalk Safety



In response to some of the concerns you submitted as part of the Survey that was sent out via the email blast, we have been in touch with the City & County regarding crosswalk safety. One of the concerns that came from them watching our walking path traffic, was pedestrians and bikers not adhering to the crosswalk signals.

Once the hand has turned white, you may proceed though the intersection to cross. When it starts flashing the orange hand, keep going, don't stop half way through. The signal will tell you how much more time you have to cross. If you have not started crossing yet and it is blinking orange, do not cross. Also, when there is a solid orange hand, do not cross.

## //ATIONAL DO NOT CALL REGISTRY

**Tired of Sales Calls?** You can register your phone with the Federal Trade Commission to stop unwanted sales calls for FREE. Here's some information from their website <a href="https://www.consumer.ftc.gov/articles/0108-national-donot-call-registry">https://www.consumer.ftc.gov/articles/0108-national-donot-call-registry</a>

#### **How do I register?**

Add your phone number for free by visiting donotcall.gov, or calling 1-888-382-1222 from the phone you want to register (TTY: 1-866-290-4236).

If you register online, you will receive a confirmation email from donotcall.gov. You must click on the link in the email within 72 hours to complete your registration.

#### How long does it take?

Your phone number should show up on the Registry the next day. Most sales calls will stop once your number has been on the Registry for 31 days. You can verify that your number is on the Registry by visiting donotcall.gov or calling 1-888-382-1222.

### <u>If I register my number, will ALL</u> unwanted calls stop?

No, the Do Not Call Registry prohibits sales calls. You still may receive political calls, charitable calls, debt collection calls, informational calls, and telephone survey calls.

In addition, companies may still call if you've recently done business with the company, or if you've given the company written permission to call you. However, if you ask a company not to call you again, it must honor your request. Record the date of your request.

# **VO "AIR BNB"**IN KILN CREEK PLEASE!

We are all familiar with "Air BnB's" by now; from stories on the news, to the friends you know who advertise their house on various websites. But what you may not know, is that any kind of "Air BnB" activity is prohibited in Kiln Creek and many other Community Associations. Our Rules & Standards say that if you will be leasing your home it must be for a minimum of one-year, AND only one lease is permitted per home. Therefore, our documents prohibit the rental/leasing of your home to (potentially) multiple people for short periods of time. If we see that a home is being advertised for this purpose, you will be sent a violation notice. Fortunately, we have not had too many problems with this yet; however, other nearby Associations have had to take owners to court. The Courts recognize this is not permitted in most Community Associations, and a judicial injunction is placed upon the owner forcing them to stop their practices.

Although it can be temping, and might make sense for owners that do not live in an association; we ask our Kiln Creek residents, PLEASE DO NOT advertise your home on any type of "Air BnB" website.
